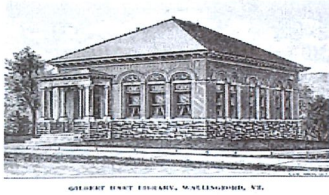

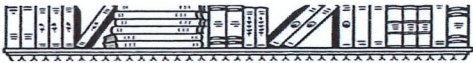

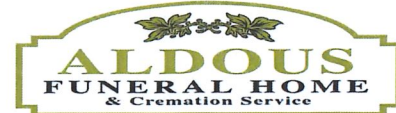

~Green Mountain Passport~

Have you heard about the Vermont State Park Visitor's Pass Discount Program for Seniors and Veterans?

To be eligible for a life-long State Parks Passport, a person must be a legal resident of Vermont and either 62 years of age or older or a Veteran of the uniformed services. (Proof required for Veterans under the age of 62.)



Use your Green Mountain Passport for: admission to Vermont State Parks (overnight camping and other park fees are excluded); Vermont State Historic Sites; and Events which are fully State sponsored. The Vermont State Fair in Rutland honors the passport for free admittance on one of their fair days.

To receive a Green Mountain Passport card, stop in to the Town Clerk's office in the town/city in which you are a resident. The cost is \$2.00.

Japanese Knotweed Control Project

There is an ever-expanding patch of Japanese Knotweed on the corner of Route 140 and Waldo Lane. You look at it every time you turn to go to Stone Meadow or the Transfer Station. Japanese Knotweed can be found all over town but this is a highly visible spot as you enter or leave the village and it lies next to Otter creek, a primary way for seeds to be carried so more Knotweed sprouts downstream. The Selectboard approved our access to the property, Town-owned land, to do a control project to limit the spread of this invasive plant.

On Saturday, June 8th from 9-12, we plan to gather at the site and work quickly together to reclaim this corner. The process has been used successfully in New Hampshire and involves cutting back, tarping, and mulching the patch for FIVE years. After the five years pass, the site should be clean and we'll celebrate by planting a native sugar maple (donated) on that corner. While one of us will monitor the site over that time, the team intervention is this one day for 3 hours in June. Come and join us! We could use any old ratty tarps you have.

Please do NOT throw garbage or household waste into the portable restroom at the recreational area. Also, do not deposit bags of household trash in the recreational area garbage cans.





✓ **Community Food Cupboard** The food cupboard at the Wallingford Town Hall is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m. to Noon. Contact the Town Clerk's Office at (802) 446-2336 with any questions. Thank you for our residents who make donations to this worthy cause.

✓ **American Legion Breakfast** is at the First Congregational Church, 189 South Main Street, on the first Tuesday of each month at 8:00 a.m.

✓ **Rutland County Solid Waste District** will sponsor free Household Hazardous Waste collection days at the Transfer Station on: July 20th from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and September 21st from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.

In order to use this program, residents must adhere to the following requirements:

Proof of residency (Driver's License); Must be a resident in the town only; and have a Detailed material list and quantity.

Limit 10 gallons or 30 items per household. All participants must remain in vehicle with a mask on until notified. All materials to dispose of must be organized such that it can be placed upon a table in little time. Do not use garbage bags. A staff member will process paperwork to include contact information. Before arriving to drop off, participants must have a completed, materials drop-off list. This materials list should be legible with each material and volume on it.



When this is completed, participants will be asked to exit the vehicle and place materials on table, and maintain social distancing. Excessive materials will not be accepted and will be referred to the Gleason Road facility. Nothing will be returned (gas cans etc.). Please leave your pets at home.

Material Limits: no more than, 10 gallons of paint, 10 bulbs, no E-Waste, and 5 gallons of used oil. (Used oil has a small fee.)
