Transfer Station Reminder
No plastics of any kind – Ziploc bags,
plastic bags, plastic containers –
should be placed in the compost bin.

Items allowed in the compost bin:
vegetables and fruit peels, dairy
products, meat, fish, bones, bread, rice,
pasta, tea bags, grounds, filters,
cooking oil, eggshells and soiled
napkins.

NOT allowed in the food scrap bin: cans, bottles, glass, paper products, cardboard, plastic bags, plastic containers, Styrofoam, disposable cups or cutlery, shrink wrap, motor oil and grease, pet or human waste, and hazardous materials.

There will be activities and music in town throughout the day, including around the library, at the Rotary building, in the Town Hall, and at the Wallingford Block, which will be celebrating its 200th birthday! Food trucks will be parked on Main Street and Depot Street to add to the amazing food you can get at our Wallingford cafes.

In the late afternoon the bike parade will lead the way to continuing festivities and food trucks at the Recreation Area by Meadow Street, with music from DJ Brett Myhre, followed by the Lawrence Kaminski Memorial Fireworks Show after the sun goes down.




Once again the library will host a great STEM event for kids on Wallingford Day, July 20th, in the morning...stay tuned for details.







Selectboard Meeting Highlights

6/3. Road Commissioner P. Baker gave an update on FY24 paving; discussed modifications needed to be made to the '16 Kenworth in order to pull the trailer and excavator; and discussed adding additional work to the FY25 paving projects.

The Selectboard: 1) heard a complaint about a trash collector blocking the solid waste bin at the TS; 2) reviewed the annual Investment Report; 3) heard activity and purchase updates from two Rec Committee members; 4) had a discussion concerning the bees at Stone Meadow with some taxpayers and some of the Conservation Commission members; 5) approved getting a vest and a magnetic sign for the Constable's car so that he can be a visible presence at the ballfield and Elfin Lake; 6) held a lengthy discussion about Town Hall Boiler Replacement Engineering Services and Heat Pumps with Energy Committee members; 7) accepted D. Castonguay's resignation from the Energy Committee; 8) appointed A. Awad to the Shade Tree Preservation Committee; 9) authorized K. Luzader to sign a Subgrant Agreement for FEMA reimbursement of expenses related to the July 2023 flood; 10) approved the VT Farmers Food Center's request to use the building once for a free health screenings; 11) approved R. Reynolds request to use the Town's bulk mail permit for Wallingford Alumni Association fundraiser letters indefinitely; 12) approved waiving the two peddler permit fees for the food trucks participating in Wallingford Day; 13) approved issuing a Selectboard letter outlining fines to dog owners who did not register their dogs by the April 1 statutory deadline; and 14) discussed the Restorative Justice Program option for six youths issued No Trespass orders related to an Elfin Lake incident.

6/17. The Selectboard: 1) agreed to send Pike a paving contract for \$85,764 and delay action for additional paving for Church Street until the next meeting; 2) approved the FY25 Sheriff's contract; 3) accepted the Arts & Community Spaces Grant; 4) agreed that C. Behrendt and J. Jankus would serve on a subcommittee to work on a grant application to construct beach erosion measures at Elfin Lake public beach; 5) discussed the noise ordinance as a result of an Ames Company rep's inquiry regarding noise restrictions if they started a second shift; 6) approved the Wallingford Day firework's permit; 7) discussed offering community service through Restorative Justice to the six youths issued No Trespass orders for Elfin Lake; 8) approved the Energy Committee's proposal to issue request for proposals to install heat pumps at Town Hall as well as hiring Engineer D. Dupras to attend the site visit for the Town Hall boiler replacement; 9) agreed to hold only one meeting in July on the 15th; and 10) following executive session, approved 3% raises for all employees.




